Link House Portacabins

As our school grows in numbers and as we look forward towards work commencing at Eden House, we have been provided with a refurbishment of the portacabins that currently sit towards the end of the school. This will provide us with more classroom capacity and a hall space in the interim period. The work will start during the week commencing Monday 18th July, which means the work can be carried out over the summer holidays and in time for school reopening to students on Wednesday 7th September. As a result of this, the date of the curriculum subject workshops has been postponed from Monday 18th July to Tuesday 14th September from 5:30pm to 7:30pm.

Car Parking Changes

In order for the above work to commence on Monday 18th July, we will be asking all parents to drop off and pick up their children from Eden House. The school closes for the summer break at 12pm on Wednesday 20th July (except for parents of students in year 6, who can collect their children from Eden House at 3:00pm).

The release of the White Paper

Periodically, education goes through policy change and the publication of the White Paper in March 2022 brought forward some significant developments that the government aims to deliver for all schools by 2030. This policy paper titled: “Opportunity for all: strong schools with great teachers for your child” demonstrates how the education system can deliver on the government’s priority to level up across the country. The economic benefits of meeting the white paper’s ambitions, and the case for a fully trust led system, are also set out within it. We see this as an opportunity for our school to start thinking about shaping its own future.


Mrs Woodward nominated **Simarpreet** in year 2S for the service award. For always offering to do jobs in the classroom.

Shakespeare In Action Workshop

Last Thursday, Mrs Gill had organised for a professional actor and performer, from West End in Schools theatre company, to deliver a number of Shakespeare workshops for all Year 7 and Year 8 groups, on a play they are currently studying. Year 7's workshops were based on Shakespeare's 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' and Year 8's workshops were based on 'Romeo and Juliet'.

The actor was thoroughly engaging! He taught pupils how to deliver important scenes and key lines as well as how to focus on characters' emotions in a humorous and interactive manner, whilst effectively linking to Elizabethan theatre and contextual factors. By the end of each workshop, pupils had worked in groups to dissect a scene, create their own interpretation of it, perform the scene in front of their peers and digest lots of acting tips.



Pupil voice and evaluations indicated that **all** pupils thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and the only improvements were that that they wanted more time with the actor and further develop their own confidence skills. What's more, 90% of pupils would relish the opportunity to do something similar in the future.

5A Jubilee Activities






Careers Update




