Absence from School

Dear Parents

If your child is absent from school due to an illness, a medical appointment or Covid-19 you must inform the school office daily by 8.30 stating clearly the pupils name, class/tutor group and a detailed reason. You can talk to the Receptionist or leave a message on the absence line from 8am.

You must ring the school every day if your child is absent unless you have a doctors letter stating the length of absence.

Term Time Holiday Request

Holidays should not be booked during term time, if you are intending to take your child out of school for a period of time, you must fill in a Term Time Holiday Request Form which you can collect from the school office. Only exceptional circumstances will a leave of absence/holiday be authorised. The new directive from the Local Authority is that no holidays should be authorised during term time and children should be in school during this time.

RE WITH EYFS

In RE they have been learning about special places, in particular they looked at the similarities and differences between a church, a temple and a mosque. They discovered that all three special places have stain glass windows. They were so intrigued by the artwork that they created their own stain glass window in the classroom. They love looking at the colours in the window and seeing the light reflect on the walls when the sun shines. When you walk into school see if you can spot our own stain glass window.







NHS Allied Work Experience Programme



We are delighted to announce that the NHS Allied Work Experience Programme is in full swing and available for your year 10-13 or S3-S6 students to participate in. All students will be awarded with a Work Experience Certificate for participating in the day. This is something that they can include in their UCAS and Apprenticeship Applications. The next Work Experience day is on the Sunday 6th February and will cover the following healthcare careers:
