### **HOLA MOHALLA**



On Tuesday 26th March 2024 Sikhs across the globe will be celebrating the auspicious occasion of Hola Mahalla. This festival was formally started by the 10th Guru of the Sikhs, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji. Hola literally means 'an armies charge' and Mahalla means 'large procession'. The festival is a celebration of the warrior spirit of the Khalsa. Guru Gobind Singh Ji started the festival for Sikhs to practice their battle skills. Guru Ji would organise Sikhs into different battalions, and they would defend and attack forts that had been built in Anandpur Sahib. Sikhs would practice all of their martial skills along with horse riding. The festival is of upmost significance for the Khalsa, this was emphasised by the 10th Guru themselves, as they left Anandpur Sahib after months of being under siege their eldest Sahibzada (son) Baba Ajit Singh Ji looked back at the city of Anandpur Sahib and asked if they would ever return to the city. Guru Ji replied by saying whenever the Khalsa partake in Hola Mahalla we will be present, such was the honour bestowed upon the Khalsa by Guru Ji.

Over the weekend Sikhs from across the globe will embark on journeys to the land of Anandpur Sahib to seek the blessing of Guru Gobind Singh Ji. There will three days of prayers and meditation, singing of hymns and serving of mass langars (free kitchens) which will feed the hundreds and thousands of visitors. On the day of Hola Nihang Singhs (Sikh warriors) will lead processions through the city before entering into a stadium where they showcase their martial skills. Awards including large amounts of money will be given to those who impress the Chiefs of the battalions with their skills in sword fighting and horse riding. I would like to take this opportunity to wish all those celebrating a Happy Hola Mahalla.

# Vaisakhi Holiday Competition


Prize for tallest entry

Faith Leaders are setting you a challenge! During the Easter holidays you are invited to take part in our faith competition to see who can build the tallest Nishaan Sahib.

The Nishaan Sahib dates back to 1606 when the Sixth Guru Har Gobind Sahib Ji flew the first Sikh flag over Akaal Takhat in Amristar, India to mark this place as a seat of Sikh sovereignty and authority. The Nishaan Sahib is a yellow (saffron) triangular flag bearing the Sikh symbol of Khanda that flies outside from every Gurdwara. The term 'Nishaan' means 'flag' and 'sahib' is a term of respect. The flag's symbol is known as Khanda, and it displays a double-edged sword called a khanda (Miri and Piri) in the centre, a circular chakkar, and two single-edged swords and on the outer sides there are two single-edged swords. Guru Gobind Singh imprinted two symbols on the Nishaan Sahib after the formalization of the Khalsa order in 1699: a cooking vessel to represent degh (food for all) and a sword, known as a tegh (justice for all). These concepts were Sikh ideals to live up to and were represented by these symbols on the flag. At every Vasakhi the Nishaan Sahib is lowered, the pole washed in milk and water, and then a new chaula (flag) is attached and raised.

Be creative and think about the materials and resources you will use to wrap the flagpole and triangular flag. What will you use to make your flagpole study and tall? Kitchen rolls and sellotape may help you. How will you draw and decorate the Khanda? Will you add tassels to the end of the flag?

Please bring your Nishaan Sahib to school on **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> April** and meet Mrs P Kaur before school in the main playground to display your competition entry. Make sure you have a name and class/form label clearly displayed on your Nishaan sahib.





### **INFORMATION**



Only on the days students have PE can they be in school wearing their school PE kits. This does not include branded wear, hoodies or leggings.
