SECONDARY NEWS




Last Thursday, thirty Year 10 pupils partook in the annual, all-day workshop that was designed to progressively build skills that will help with life skills and confidence, something that students often tell trainers they want from school. Building self-esteem and developing speaking skills are also an integral part of the workshops to enable young people to become more confident and established public speakers. The event was hosted by Speakers Trust as part of the Speak Out Challenge Competition that takes place regionally and nationally every year.

Several activities were built into the workshop. Pupils explored:

- How they would make the day work with each other.
- Warm up games where they had to work as a team to organise and introduce themselves using various greeting styles.
- 'Comfort' and 'challenge' zones; the behaviours of introverts and extroverts and how we can make it all work successfully; where public speaking is used in life; and top tips.
- The communication triangle focusing on content, delivery, and structure to influence our listeners on how they thought, felt and acted.
- Speaking on the spot using facts, examples, and PEP (point, explain, point) as a base for structuring impromptu speaking and supporting points.
- Giving feedback using WIN (wonderful, improve, notice).
- Generating ideas and combining different concepts when provided with a clear brief.
- Telling successful stories to engage a listener.
- 5 S's (stride, stand, smile, speak, stay) for use when delivering their speech.

By the end of the day, most pupils had planned, practised, and performed a short speech on a topic of their choice and are now in a good position for their upcoming GCSE English Spoken Language Presentations and careers interviews.

Some of the stories and speeches produced were fantastic! Pupils chose a wide repertoire of topics they were passionate about ranging from: Nutella, protests, women's rights, homework, mental health, culture, social media and much more.




























SECONDARY NEWS


