





PRIMARY NEWS



HARDIT SINGH MALIK

Hardit Singh Malik was a groundbreaking Indian pilot and the first Indian fighter pilot in the British Royal Flying Corps (RFC).

He overcame his racial barriers to join the British forces and went on to play an important role in promoting Indian interests internationally.

He joined the Indian Civil Services (ICS) and later served as a diplomat. He passed away, October 31, 1985, at the age of 80. Hardit Singh Malik's life is remembered for his courage, skill and contributions to India's early military and diplomat efforts.

Born in 1894 in what is now Pakistan.

Malik is known for his bravery as a pilot and later as a diplomat.

After the war, Malik returned to India where he continued to break barriers.

Research shows that if your child misses 17 days of school, they are at risk of dropping a whole grade in their GCSEs. Please support your child with their attendance.

Punctuality

All pupils should be in school by 8.30 am. Children arriving into school after this time without a valid reason will serve a lunchtime detention. A text message will be sent to their parents/carers as per the information on the data collection sheet by Mrs Alcock.

Workshops

This workshop is to highlight the importance of attendance and the detrimental impact of taking holidays during term time can have on your child's attainment and progress.






