Dear Parent/Carer,

We are tremendously excited to have reached the halfway point of our school's expansion. In conjunction with the DfE and contractors Bowmer & Kirkland we opened our new build named PIRI in May 2024 and await the full refurbishment of our original building to open during summer 2025. The PIRI building provides five new and fully equipped science laboratories, a 3G pitch, MUGA and Sports Hall. To follow, in the MIRI Building, we will be offering a music and performing arts theatre, design and technology-based classrooms, an additional library, a Divan Hall and more sports and outdoor play facilities.

In the last two years, our school has gone from an Ofsted rating of RI to Good and from a Section 48 Faith Inspection of Good to Outstanding. This rapid improvement and sustained trajectory shines a light on the dramatic change in the school's journey towards stability and strength. In the 2022 Ofsted report it stated, "Pupils benefit from attending a welcoming and inclusive school. The Seva virtues of kindness, courage, honesty, tolerance, respect and responsibility are woven into the curriculum and understood by everyone. Leaders have high expectations of all pupils and expect them to work hard and achieve their best." In the 2024 Section 48 Faith Inspection report it stated: "As a result of excellent teaching, pupils make strong progress which is evident in their books and the lessons. Teachers know their well pupils and plan the lessons effectively in order to meet their needs. Teachers have high expectations of pupils' behaviour and conduct in lessons. In turn, pupils respond extremely well and attitudes towards learning are excellent. Pupils are confident and able to articulate their learning over time, including key vocabulary." I am sure you will agree with me when saying this is high praise for a very high performing school.

As the only Sikh faith school in Coventry, we are immensely proud of our ability to share the Sikh values, ethos and high expectations with all our pupils across all faiths and backgrounds. The three key principles of the Sikh faith, afforded to us by the founder of the Sikh faith Guru Nanak Dev Ji, are Naam Japna (Remember God), Kirat Karne (Work hard) and Vand Shakna (goodwill to all others). They are interwoven in our school's standards of selfless Service, Excellence, Virtues and Aspiration and form the names of our three Houses for our pupil points system.

The results 2023 – 2024 are exceptional and we are delighted to share them with you. As an all-through school for pupils aged 4 to 16, we report on the following: Early Years Good Level of Development (GLD), Year 1 Phonics, Year 4 Multiplication Timetables Checks (MTC), End of Key Stage 2, Year 6 SATS and End of Key Stage 4, Year 11 GCSEs.

The results are testament to the dedication and pride felt by all the trustees, leaders, teachers and support staff in our school and reflect the tenacity and drive of all our pupils, their families and the whole community. Together we work relentlessly and with enthusiasm to deliver a tremendously high-quality of education that motivates us to keep on striving even higher.

As an all-through school we offer automatic admission into secondary for all our pupils who are registered in our primary. Pupils in Years 5 and 6 are given opportunities to engage in lessons with teachers in secondary in time for them to prepare for the transition. Teachers in subjects, for example, PE, Seva Studies and MFL teach across the school to support continuity. With regular joint staff meetings between teachers in both primary and secondary, pupils benefit from a coherent and seamless learning pathway through the school which greatly benefits their attainment and progress.
