## **SECONDARY NEWS**

## Residential Visit to the Battlefields



In the very early hours of Wednesday 17th April, we set off from Seva School to start our journey to Ypres. Despite the lack of sleep, our students were excited and chatted about the adventure to come. We picked up our guides, Alain and Edwin at Folkestone just before arriving at Dover. We disembarked at passport control and sensibly lined up to get our passports checked and it was at this point that Alain commented on how well everyone had conducted themselves. Then we got on the ferry. The duty free was certainly a hit and despite a few students turning a bit green, no one was seasick.

We immediately drove to Ypres and went to Grootebeke British ceremony to pay our respects. We learnt about the 4 Indian cavalry regiments as part of the British Expeditionary forces in Belgium who held off the Germans when they first invaded. The students learnt the poignant reason why some graves are inscribed with 'Known Unto God.' We then went to Passchendele Museum which the students enjoyed. The museum showed the sheer scale of some of the shells and small artillery guns. The students were able to experience what it was like being in an underground shelter and then went outside to walk through reconstructed trenches. A lot of the students reflected on how claustrophobic it made them feel and this gave way to reflective questions to the guides. It was clear that our students were beginning to think about how the soldiers felt. We saw some more British grave cemeteries and then in stark contrast visited Langemarck German cemetery where the German soldiers were buried in mass pits, without the grandeur and pride that the British cemeteries display. With this and the story of the Christmas truce the students reflected on the injustices of war, then and now.

After a long day of traveling, learning, and reflecting we went to a restaurant for dinner in Ypres and then to the chocolate shop. Even walking to the chocolate shop was an experience as suddenly it began to hail, and the group had to run for shelter. We finally arrived at our accommodation and students enjoyed some down time.

The next morning, we woke up early and headed off to learn about the Battle of the Somme and the tragic amount of loss incurred in the first ten minutes alone. The tour guides did a fantastic job in teaching the students how a platoon worked and with Alain having 30 years' experience in the military students were fascinated.

We went to Sunken Lane and learnt about Lieutenant Colonel 'Maniac' who led his men into battle. The students were shown a photo of where the soldiers sat in wait, and we realised we were stood in the exact same spot. We walked over to the Lochnagar crater and grasped the sheer size of the site which was blown up by the British. We then went to Thiepval before heading to the Neuve-Chappelle memorial to the Indian soldiers. As we pulled up, we saw the Nishan Sahib flying high. After two long days of paying our respects, we had come to the end. The group got together, and Mr Singh led the Chaupai Sahib ceremony for our ancestors who gave up their lives in a land so far away. After learning about the bravery and valour of the soldiers we reflected and gave our thanks. Jeevan and Taj lay a wreath on behalf of Seva School and then we remembered in silence.

After this, we made our journey home. How lucky we are!

# **INFORMATION**
